He competed in several Australian Karate Federation and Japanese Karate Association competitions.

In 1987 he was voted the number one competitor in *kata* and *kumite* in an independent martial arts magazine.

Sensei Edji was the Australian *kata* coach from 2006-2008 and has also refereed and judged in state, national and international competitions. He holds the rank of Godan which is the fifth degree black belt. National rep Jasmine Rafiq was one of the participants at the training.
